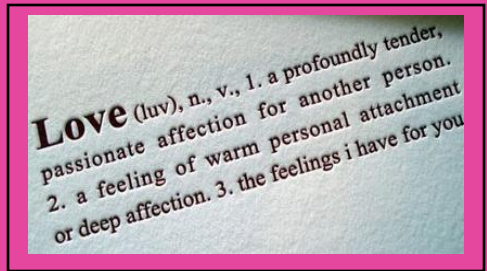


Famous Love Definitions
